



# How to Read Your PG TES Report

Target Audience: Supervisors

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### PG TEACHER EFFECTIVENESS SCORE (TES)


There are two TES evaluation reports that are generated for PG teaching activities through MedSIS:

- Presenter TES Report Captures and aggregates evaluation data completed during PG academic teaching events.
- **Clinical Supervision TES Report** Captures and aggregates evaluation data completed during PG clinical rotations.

#### **TES REPORT FORMAT**

There is one template used for both clinical and presenter teaching evaluation reports. Your TES form will contain the following information...

#### **TES Header:**



#### Some notes:

- The "number of evaluations completed" versus the "number of learners" will give you an indication of how many learners you taught and how many completed evaluations during the activity time frame.
- Your TES score is the mean value of evaluation data captured and completed during the activity time frame.
- The "evaluation completed between" time frame will be different than "evaluation for activities between" time frame, as learners have 14 days after evaluations are triggered to complete presenter evaluations, and 60 days after evaluations are triggered to complete clinical faculty evaluations.

#### Some notes:

- Both presenter and clinical supervision TES reports are scored out of 7.
- The questions asked in the presenter and clinical supervision evaluations will be different.
- The mean, medium, and standard deviation values give you your own score per question in comparison to "All Teachers." The "All Teachers" values are aggregated scores of supervisors/faculty teaching in the same program, for the same teaching activity, and during the same time frame.
